FREE PRESCRIPTIONS

If you tick 1 or more of the criteria below then you may be entitled to free or reduced cost towards prescriptions, dentistry, opticians and more.



- A. 60 or over
- B. Under 16
- C. 16 to 18 and in full-time education
- D. Are pregnant or have had a baby in the previous 12 months and have a valid maternity exemption certificate (MatEx)
- E. Have a specified medical condition and have a valid medical exemption certificate (MedEx)
- F. Have a continuing physical disability that prevents you going out without help from another person and have a valid medical exemption certificate (MedEx)
- G. Hold a valid war pension exemption certificate and the prescription is for your accepted disability
- H. Are an NHS inpatient

You're also entitled to free prescriptions if you or your partner (including civil partner) receive, or you're under the age of 20 and the dependant of someone receiving:

If you're entitled to or named on:
